Oscar M. Lynn, a Prineville resident, passed away on Tuesday, July 24, 2007. He was 94 years old.

He worked as an operating engineer for several contractors, building freeways, dams, bridges, and retiring in 1975. From The Dalles he moved to Cornelius, Ore., in 1974 until moving to Prineville in 1991.

He married Ola A. Thomas on April 20, 1938, in Bakersfield, Calif.

He was a member of the Masonic Lodge for 70 years, the Prineville Lodge No. 76 A.F.& A.M., and a member of the Church of Christ in The Dalles.

Oscar enjoyed the outdoors, hunting, and especially fishing, traveling, playing cards, games and socializing with family.
